

 The Maya in San Francisco
The number of Maya living in San Francisco is still unknown, but is believed that there are between
10,000 to 15,000 Yucatec Maya in San Francisco alone

- Remittances to Yucatan amounted 52 million dollars by December 2003
- By 2004 this number dramatically increased to 80 million dollars.
- 15% of consular ID's were issued to Yucatecs
- \* 85% are males and 15% women
- 90% speaks Mayan and feel more comfortable speaking Maya
- 62% moved to San Francisco less than 5 years ago

- -Language barriers
- -Wary of outsiders
- -Minimum level of education
